REASONS WHY THIS PROJECT IS EXEMPT OR DOES NOT REQUIRE FURTHER ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION:

State California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines sec 21080(b)(1) states:

*"This division does not apply to any of the following activities:
(1) Ministerial projects proposed to be carried out or approved by public agencies."*

Landscape improvements are a ministerial project approved by the City in accordance with established City municipal code ordinances and polices. These landscape improvements have negligible or no permanent effects on the landscape and will not result in the taking of rare, endangered or threatened species of plants or animals. Review by City staff confirmed that no exemptions apply that would preclude the use of a notice of exemption for this project. The Department has concluded that no significant environment impact would occur to aesthetics, agriculture and forestland or timberland, air quality, biological resources, cultural resources, energy geology and soils, greenhouse gas emissions, hazards, and hazardous materials, hydrology and water quality, land use planning, mineral resources, noise population and housing, public services, recreation, transportation or traffic, tribal cultural resources, utilities and service systems or wildlife.
